CHRISTMAS JOY OFFERING

Session last met on Monday, November 26th. Many matters were discussed and acted upon. Below are just a few to note:

- *Security System: A small task force of session has contacted three different companies regarding options for security systems. At the December meeting a system will be selected.
- ***Trees:** The four trees at the front of the Sanctuary (west side) need to be removed. Bruce Coxworth offered to remove the trees (family owns a tree farm/business) and asked that the money saved be spent to install new security lighting on the building/parking lot. Session concurred.
- ***FCOC Representatives:** Sylvia Keeler and Natalie Lucas have been re-elected to be our board reps for the Flushing Christian Outreach Center with Session's thanks.
- *Esther Ballard Estate: Esther included the church in her will; we will be receiving \$2,000. Session has voted to put the money in an interest bearing New Covenant Fund until needed. We thank God for her generosity and continued support of the church.
- *Pictorial Directory: By December 7th, the layout and photos we took should be on their way to Universal Directory. Hopefully, the booklets will be in hand in January.
- ***Records Review:** Carol Dulin, Clerk of Session, took our church records to be reviewed in Midland. They were approved without exception.
- *Stated Clerk Heads Up: Ted McCulloch, Stated Clerk of the Presbytery, wants elders and members to be aware that if a member receives online ordination from a church granting authority to conduct a wedding, that person is no longer a member of PC(USA). WHY? Because a person cannot be a member of two churches at the same time. (This was a WHOA moment. Please be aware.)
- *Yard Signs to be Offered: The yard sign which is currently sitting outside the pastor's office will be offered for purchase at a cost of \$15 per sign. A larger banner of the sign will be placed on a stand and put on display. The signs are offered from All Souls Episcopal Church out of Washington D.C.
