


Souper Bowl


Calling all 7th and 8th graders and their parents!

Per Capita

The Per Capita Apportionment for 2014 is \$24.03. (General Assembly - \$7.02, Synod of the Covenant - \$3.25, Presbytery of Lake Huron - \$13.76) Please remember that Flushing Presbyterian Church is assessed a Per Capita of \$24.03 for every confirmed member of your family. Consider making your per capita payment as soon as you are able, by using the Per Capita envelope that is included with your offering envelopes, or by simply indicating "Per Capita" on the memo line of your check.

Session Update

The first meeting with the newly installed session members took place Monday, January 26th. It was a great meeting. Work that had begun in 2013 was presented to the new session and continues to be supported. Some highlights:

- Personnel presented new evaluation forms for the pastor and other paid positions
- Celebrated all the great outreach being done by our members. Below is part of an email from our Clerk of Session. The first paragraph is the question she is responding to in filling out the Clerk's Report to General Assembly.

"During 2013, how many different individuals would you estimate that the members of your congregation served or ministered among as they carried out the various activities, programs, and outreach of the congregation? (Include visitors and other non-members who attended worship and other events at the church, as well as any persons whom members had contact with beyond the church property as they carried out mission and ministries (including compassion, justice, and advocacy work) on behalf of the congregation.)"

[Carol's thoughts] We would count (in no particular order): visitors to all our services (regular & special--Good Friday, All Saints, etc.), contacts with Pioneer Kids, VBS, North End Soup Kitchen, FCOC (we have members who work there, as well as provide food & other goods on a regular basis, meals for their workers, warmth tree, Thanksgiving food baskets & Angel Tree), the prayer retreats, youth Group activities, caroling, hosting the Presbytery meeting, the table at the Harvest Festival, Blood Drives, Family Promise interactions, Relay for Life, softball game, rummage sale, card ministry, prayer shawls, Health Fair Kits, backpack collection, calendar collection, hosted two Concerts, Mystery Dinner, funeral dinners, weddings, baptisms, prayer chain!!!

- The Session had a "wild-eyed guess" of **2,500 that have been touched by our members**. We think that guess may be low. Great job!!
- Discussed putting together a presentation about facility improvements. A work group is addressing this
 and will have info for the congregation. Due to elapsed time, verification of estimates will need to be
 conducted.
- Discussed the question which came up at the Annual Congregational meeting: What is being done to grow our church? Answer: A number of new initiatives have been tried over the year. The session and pastor have been doing and trying new things. But for whatever reason, we have been missing the mark with the members. So conversation is needed about what we, the church, want to be and are willing to put our time and energy into, relying on the Holy Spirit to lead, guide and inspire.
- Discussed writing a Grant Request to Synod. Members of Community Outreach, Property, and Budget and Finance in consultation with the pastor will be working on this project.

Many other matters were discussed. There are so many ministries happening that we take for granted. One of our silent ministries are the cards in each restroom with numbers to call for help if you or someone you know is being abused. Over a hundred cards have been taken. We have a lot of people who come through our building. This is a needed outreach and we send each with a prayer.

Please talk to your session if you have questions or comments. They are a great Team!!


