#### Maundy Thursday Service Thursday, April 13 7:00 PM

The Maundy Thursday Service will focus on the events of Thursday evening with Jesus and the disciples. We will remember and participate in that first communion service. The service will conclude in the Garden with words of betrayal. It is a somber service as we consider the emotional tensions of this very special night.



Good Friday Service Friday, April 14 6:30 PM

Last year, we held our first ever *Stations of the Cross* service. It was so meaningful, that numerous members have asked that we offer the service again this year.

The Stations are ones recommended by the Office of Theology & Worship, PC(USA). We begin with Jesus in the garden of Gethsemane and weave our way to the final scene - The Tomb.


Join us for an evening of reflection and meditation as we remember Jesus' sacrifice and gift to us.



This year, the prayer vigil will be held from the end of the Maundy Thursday service until 1:00 AM on Good Friday and then from 5 AM until 10:00 AM. Members and friends of Flushing Presbyterian Church are encouraged to participate. This vigil is based on Mark 14:32-43, which recounts the story of Jesus going to Gethsemane to pray.

The prayer vigil is a time of personal meditation, prayer and scripture reading. The vigil is divided into half-hour segments. People of the congregation are asked to fill these segments so that at least one person is present in the sanctuary praying, reading and/or meditating during the hours Christ asked his disciples to stay awake and watch.

A sign-up sheet is on the bulletin board. You may take more than one segment. Prayerfully consider participating in this meaningful time of watching waiting, and praying.

### Expanding our view of service

We often think of serving in terms of Matthew 25: supplying food and clothing; caring for the sick, incarcerated and other "least of these" members of society — serving Jesus in the process. But we also can serve him with our unique talents and by doing things we love.

For example, Ged King, a barber in England, devotes some of his time off to giving homeless people free haircuts. Imagine Jesus saying, "For my hair was long and scraggly, and you cut it" — or "My heart was lonely, and you played music to lift my spirits. I could no longer read small print, and you read to me. I have to work two jobs, and you invited my child to spend afternoons crafting with you. My car broke down, and you repaired it." Then the King will say, "Come, you who are blessed by my Father ... *whatever* you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me" (Matthew 25:34, 40, NIV; emphasis added).
