STICKY MISSION

In June, Mike Keeler, Steve Howe and I attended a workshop on Stewardship. Wait!!! Don't stop reading! Stewardship is not primarily about money, but rather our relationship with the Lord and our thankfulness. So stewardship is really a great opportunity to check in and assess that relationship.

Will this happen? Only if we, the church, see it as an outreach opportunity to promote goodness in the world and volunteers step up and say, "Count me in!"
