


FALL STUDY: Through November 15th & 18th

A Reflection

Recently, a member asked that I share session devotions - at least a portion. This past meeting we focused on one segment of our fall study, "The Call". We read four pages (55-58) in which the author talks about God's call to us in worship. Paul and Barnabas, along with the disciples, were seeking God's direction. Through prayer, fasting and worshiping together they found God's leading.

The author, Adam Hamilton, reflects how he regularly meets God in corporate worship, in all kinds of settings. How does he do that? On his way to worship, he prays a prayer something like this, "Lord, please speak to me in worship today." The author begins to prepare himself to encounter God. We are encouraged to do the same. It's really more than just the preaching or the music through which God speaks. It's about us getting ourselves ready and focused.

There are too many good thoughts in these few pages. I encourage you to pick up copies from the Welcome Desk. We will have them available. We also still have two books available. It's worth your time to read the material. It is thought provoking and inspiring. May each of us continue to hear God's call in our lives.

The beginning of Advent - November 29

November is the month of Thanksgiving, but it often also includes the beginning of a new church year. This year, November 29 is the first Sunday of Advent. The season of Advent is about Jesus, the Word, "coming." It's about anticipating and preparing for Christ's arrival.

God comes to us in many and various ways. He speaks to us through the prophets and saints. He comes and speaks to us when we are listening. He comes in the beauty and mysteries of nature. Most of all, God comes in the person of Christ, speaking to his listeners face to face.
