# From Pastor's Desk

#### The Word Became Flesh

John 1:1-5

<sup>1</sup> In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. <sup>2</sup> He was with God in the beginning. <sup>3</sup> Through him all things were made; without him nothing was made that has been made. <sup>4</sup> In him was life, and that life was the light of all mankind. <sup>5</sup> The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.

You see that passage up there? Right above this line. Read the final verse to yourself one more time. Take as much time as you need; read it until you can recite it from memory. The above lines of scripture are taken from John's first chapter, an account of the creation of the universe. It may not resemble the account of God's sevenday creation from Genesis. It also doesn't look anything like the birth narratives in Matthew or Luke. But this passage serves as a grand introduction into the story that unfolds before us. There is a both-and about the beginnings of the Christmas story. Jesus is both the creative Almighty God as well as the cherubic, tiny infant born in Bethlehem.

Now, notice something very important in that last verse. The verb tense switches from the past to the present. While that may not *look* like much at first, it's an affirmation that Jesus' presence is still shining – more than two millennia after the birth of the baby in a lowly manger stuffed with straw. I look around and I see plenty of darkness that remains in this world today: divisiveness, violence, greed. There is temptation to fall into despair. And when I feel that tug, that overwhelming anxiety that I simply cannot take one bit of bad news more...I remember verse 5. Remember that the light *still* shines in the darkness. Remember also that the darkness still has not overcome it.

Read that verse over and over again to yourself. Do not let your heart grow weary or dark. Because

"The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it."


Christmas Eve Service Friday, December 24th at 7:00 PM
