Look! He is coming with the clouds; every eye will see him, even those who pierced him; and on his account all the tribes of the earth will wail. So it is to be. Amen. "I am the Alpha and the Omega," says the Lord God, who is and who was and who is to come, the Almighty.

– Revelation 1:4-8

Does anyone remember the famous adage that goes along with the month of March? "In like a lion, out like a lamb." It's used because the weather typically turns with the vernal equinox, when the bitterness of winter gives way to the mildness of spring. While it's true we've flipped the calendar over to the subsequent month of April, I think that we would be mindful to keep the spirit of that adage when we view the movement of Holy Week. We move from the crowds' celebratory shouts of "Hosanna!" upon Jesus' arrival to Jerusalem, to the betrayal of Judas and the disciples. Ultimately those same crowds who welcomed Jesus as king decried him with shouts of "Crucify him!" And even the death in this story is fleeting, moving from moments of mourning and grief to the acknowledgement of Jesus as risen king.

Sunday of Passion and Palms

10:00 am – We will be enacting a collective reading through the story of Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem, followed by the betrayal, trial, and crucifixion of the Lord

Maundy Thursday

6:00 pm – In the social hall, we will begin with communion and then we will continue into a service of tenebrae, an extinguishing of lights as we remember our Savior who was plunged into darkness.

Good Friday

6:00 pm – In this service, entitled "And There Was Darkness," we will worship in a sanctuary stripped of adornments and enter into a time of solemn contemplation.

Easter Sunday

10:00 am – Join us as we gather to honor our risen Lord, who conquered sin and death with God's power of life-giving grace
