Throughout the four gospels, the disciples of Jesus exhibit their worries: over status and which one of them will be the greatest, who's going to have the place of honor next to Jesus, how the people Jesus hangs out with might reflect poorly on them, how the group's money is used...And note that this list is not exhaustive! Make no mistake, however, some of the worries are founded. Others, not so much.

It's very easy to worry, especially in this particular pandemic/post-pandemic time period. We worry about the fluctuating rate of transmission, masks vs. no masks, the ongoing issues with supply chains and availability of goods and services. I'm still waiting on the market for used vehicles to drop its prices to buy a second car and I feel like I've been waiting forever!

Worries just seem to be a part of our everyday living. To compound these fears and concerns, there's the ever-present concern over mass shootings, tragedies and events that occupy such space within our collective consciousness that hope for something better seems very, very distant. How do we offer a word of grace in a world that seems so unforgiving, so punishing?

Sometimes, it's difficult for us to be a resurrection people. At times things seem so hopeless, and we have the audacity to espouse hope?!? Of all things, hope! But it's into that hopeless world that Jesus comes. He didn't die for just the good and the upright, the blameless and those who come to church every Sunday and tithe with fervor. Jesus died for the sinful, for the broken, for the people and systems who both oppress and are oppressed. Jesus died for your nosy neighbor who won't stop judging how you decorate your front yard. Jesus died for the politician in the party whose policies you don't like. It's not all about working out your individual salvation with the Lord, so let's stop viewing Jesus' death and resurrection as something that took place for one or a few.

Jesus died and was raised for one and all. The great audacity of hope is that our God leaves no one behind. There is room at God's table for every one of us. Please recall that each time we celebrate communion here, for example. We remember Christ's dying and rising once again. Think very hard about who was at the table with Jesus. His disciples were all there with him. All twelve. Please remember that this means Judas Iscariot, the one who betrayed Jesus over to the authorities, was at the table as well. Jesus made room for an enemy, for someone who worked against his mission in the world. And please remember that Jesus took the time to wash his disciples' feet in an act of servanthood, before having supper with them. Yes, even Judas' feet. What does that mean for us? Are we meant to view this world with contempt, condemning it to hell and consigning it to the scrap heap? Absolutely not. We must meet the trials and tribulations of this world with love, no matter how tempting it may be to harden our hearts or become numb to the pain in the world around us.

We are gardeners toiling in God's beautiful creation, not an empire. We are resurrection people called to offer the best of news – that Christ the Lord is risen, not just 2000-plus years ago, but every day. Each day, the light dawns and the sun shines anew on this world that God deemed good enough to love and good enough to save. Never forget that.


A sign-up sheet is on the bulletin board. You may take more than one segment. Prayerfully consider participating in this meaningful time of watching, waiting, and praying.

You may have heard Nyse Hollman's presentation during the March 26 Minute for Mission. For those of you that did not, *Voices for Children* provides restorative services for abused and neglected children; protects our vulnerable children through advocacy, and prevents abuse and neglect in our communities through education. They serve approximately 200 children each month.

Children come to the Center daily and we are collecting the following items for them during the month of April:

- Snacks and Beverages: juice boxes, water bottles, hot cocoa packets, Keurig coffee pods, chips, fruit snacks, cookies, pop tarts, etc.
- Gift Cards from fast food restaurants.
- Court Support Items: coloring books, colored pencils and markers.



## FLUSHING CHRISTIAN OUTREACH CENTER




