Friends, the summer is winding to a close and the days are getting shorter. We're entering the part of the season with fewer days before us than behind us, reminded everywhere we turn that school will soon be back in session. No matter how far removed you are from your school days, or the school days of your children, I think we can all agree that seeing the back-to-school shopping sections at our local Target or Wal-Mart represents a neat example of "time's dividing line."

The days of nostalgia and summer rest are coming to an end. As we reflect on such a prospect, let us think about the novel concept of rest. We worship a God who rested on the seventh day, after six days of creating, well, *everything*. There are laws in the Old Testament that revolve around preserving the Sabbath and making it holy; the Israelites were called to rest, just as their Creator rested. Jesus is depicted as retreating from crowds in order to find rest. And need I remind you, dear reader, that Jesus was in fact *asleep* when a storm broke over the Sea of Galilee? Jesus snoozed through it and the disciples had to wake him up so he could calm the storm!

Rest is holy. Rest is sacred. Time set apart from the busyness and from the noise is something precious. It is commanded of us so that we can function at a high level and so that we can worship the Lord. Think of that, the next time your head hits the pillow! To be a good steward of the time you've been given, of the body you've been given, of your mental and emotional faculties, *you must rest*. (Now someone please tell that to my kids!)




