December brings a frenzy of activities and celebrations leading up to THE DAY of Christmas. Advent. The time we "get ready", "prepare", "anticipate" the coming of the Christ Child. We have a wide variety of ways to do this: quiet reflection, prayer, and meditation as well as calls to action - showing the world what the Christ Child came to accomplish. So which way will I go this year, because I can't do it all? --I have a family and we are very involved and busy; there is not one minute left over. --I just don't have the stamina to do it all. --I just can't put that kind of energy into my faith development right now. --Fill in your own circumstance. All of the above scenarios are real. God gets what it is like for us as we live life here on earth. The greater challenge is: what are we - each of us - doing to develop that relationship with our Lord and Savior.

So we can't do it all, but we can choose to do something. As I think about preparing for the arrival of a child, I remember all that we did. There was much book reading about the whole development process, birthing classes, nursery preparations, as well as emotional changes. And even as we were in the process of doing these things, we still were not ready - our first decided to come early - we were not ready.

As I am now in middle age, I think of preparing for the arrival of a child in a different way -- opening my heart to love someone who will be new to the family (no, I am not announcing that I'll be a grandmother, just thinking ahead). While it is still preparing, it's done in a different way.



The lighting of a candle on the first Sunday of Advent is traditionally associated with the hope that Jesus' birth brings.

Write your own prayers of hope - for yourself, people you know, our local area, world situations, etc.

Prayer: Jesus, who brings hope into hopeless situations, we thank you for your heavenly rescue mission, which we remember at Christmas. This candle reminds us of the hope that you bring. We offer up our prayers of hope, knowing that you care deeply about each and every one of these situations. Amen.
