LENT: FAITH IN DEED

Wednesday, February 14th, we begin another season of lent - the 40 days leading up to Easter, plus the six Sundays (Sundays do not "count" as they are mini Easter celebration days). Lent is when Christians remember the 40 days Jesus spent in the wilderness preparing to begin his ministry. Lent is a time for reflection, reconnecting with the Lord, and altering behaviors and attitudes as needed.

Often the focus of lent is to "give up" something to remember Christ's suffering; or to "take on" enhancing a spiritual practice. But what if we also used this time as another season of stewardship, in which we focused on generosity - actively engaging the world around us with a purpose?

This year, Spiritual Growth and I want to tap into a resource which comes out of the UK called "40Acts.org.uk". Each week the sermon will focus on a passage from James with a thought to consider and then challenge us to action for the week.

For those with email connections, you will have the opportunity to receive a daily devotional with suggested actions. Two years ago I sent these devotions to the people who were part of the "Christ Walk" group. There was positive feedback at the time. These are new devotions for 2018. There will be three ways to acquire these daily devotions: 1) On the church FaceBook page; 2) To sign up with 40acts.org.uk individually; or 3) Sign up with me and I'll send you the daily devotions (like I do with the Weekly Update). The first and third option would keep you from receiving follow-up emails from the organization.

What an opportunity we have to be a presence in the community doing good. Not for notoriety, but to bring joy to people around us and help them experience Christ in the world. We will have packets with some start up ideas to get you thinking. I look forward to experiencing Christ in new and renewed ways this year as we share our experiences with one another.

LENTEN LUNCH AND STUDY

This year our Lenten Study will be on the book of *James* (see below the topics). We will meet over lunch! It has come to our attention that there are some who do not drive after dark, so we are giving this a try. Hopefully, those who work will be close enough to pop in for lunch, participate with the conversation/study and then go back to work. We will keep it simple with soup and bread of some sort, trying to stay on the healthier side.

Our Lunch Study will begin February 21, 12:00 - 1:00 PM for five weeks. We hope you will join us!

- 2. Revisiting how we use Social Media, update our Website and make better use of our Digital Sign
- 3. Considering & Planning some intergenerational events, such as VBS and a Service Sunday
- 4. Planning on how to celebrate the 60th Anniversary of the Church. Photos for a new pictorial directory will be taken in May
- 5. Having quarterly updates from Session during Coffee Hour

The meeting ended with hilarity - thank you, Jim Wiley! - and prayer. We look forward to the coming year and the possibilities which lie ahead. It's going to be a great year.


