Ash Wednesday, March 6th From Dust to Life

At 7:00 PM, worshipers will gather for an Ash Wednesday service in recognition of the beginning of Lent.

Ashes have a long history in biblical and church traditions. In Scripture ashes symbolize frailty or death, sadness or mourning, judgment, and repentance. Ashes may also be considered as a purifying or cleansing agent.

This Ash Wednesday service will provide a service of healing - of dying with Christ and being raised to new life. Sounds like baptism? There are great parallels to tie the two together. Never been to such a service? Consider coming. Not ready for ashes? That's okay too. We pray this Lenten season will be meaningful in new ways for all.

Per Capita

- ➤ Per capita is a <u>per member</u> apportionment for the operating budget of Presbytery, Synod, and General Assembly.
- ➤ 2019 per capita is \$28.77 per member
- Members are asked to pay this amount over and above their pledge amount
- > Congregations pay per capita for each member.
- > Flushing Presbyterian Church pays per capita for each member whether the member helps offset the cost or not
- ➤ If members help offset per capita cost, more dollars are available for church projects, mission, etc.

Please consider using your per capita envelope to submit \$28.77

for each person in your family who is a member of the church.



Session met on Monday, January 28 (they braved the snow and cold). With three brand new members, time was spent getting them up to speed on current matters being addressed. Already there is lively discussion, sharing of ideas and thoughtful cooperation as we look to the new year.

Below are a few highlights of the meeting:

- Consumers Energy Program: Karen Howe is following up on information received at the December Presbytery Meeting to help churches partner with members, friends and the community in being more energy efficient. Session granted permission to move forward with the program.
- **Security:** Bill Churchill & Steve Howe will coordinate getting more members to set up system training and establish security system policies.
- **Nominating Committee:** Two elders were elected Bill Churchill and Kelli Peter. They join Denise Churchill, Carole Tucker and Kathy Miller.
- **Personnel Committee** is made up of the chairs of Spiritual Growth and Budget & Finance plus two atlarge members and a third individual which may be a serving elder or at-large member. Julie Socha, Kelli Peter and Carrie Younkin will represent session on the committee. At-large members will be sought.
- Change in Practice: Session voted to allow married couples to serve on session concurrently, with the limit of no more than half of session being married couples.


LIFT (Ladies In Fellowship Together) is a group that meets for fellowship among all ladies of the church. Trips are planned throughout the year for all ages to enjoy.
