**epiphany** (noun) – a usually sudden manifestation or perception of the essential nature or meaning of something

If you've ever found yourself stumped while working through a crossword or a sudoku puzzle, only to put the puzzle down and walk away, go about your daily business and then come bounding into the room because you've been struck by sudden insight as to the solution to the problem – you've had an epiphany. My favorite artistic representation of moments like this comes in the form of a lightbulb going off over the head of a cartoon character. They were once in the dark, so to speak, but now they have seen the light and they get it.

So it is with us. Epiphany of the Lord is observed as a church festival in commemoration of the coming of the Magi as the first manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles or in the Eastern Church in commemoration of the baptism of Christ. The three Magi come to bear witness to the light that has come into the world. John's gospel in particular is abundant in light/darkness imagery.

## John 1:1-5

It doesn't have the typical songs and nativity stories of Mark or Matthew, opting instead to focus on Jesus as there from the creation of the world, right alongside God the Father. And something important to note is that John doesn't relegate the light into the past tense. "The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it."

As the last traces of Christmas fade and we settle back into our normal routines, know that the light shines continually – even to this day. Pray that your eyes may be open to how it illuminates the darkness of the world, bringing its resplendent glory to all that it touches. And remember that God loves you with a love that is big, and broad, and deep, and wide.
