When pastors go to school to *be* pastors, their preaching professor usually advises them of the words of German theologian Karl Barth: "preach with the Bible in one hand and the newspaper in the other." While I am one of the people who subscribes to the theory that print is a dying medium (and that we consume most of our news and current events through the use of online media) I think Barth makes an excellent point. Preaching must be both true to the gospel of Jesus Christ, while remaining culturally relevant to us today; it needs to tell the people of the Word of God while also speaking to what is happening in the world today.

And to that end, I am proud to announce a four-part sermon series for the month of January that will do just that. You might recall back in the month of November I preached about the Israeli-Hamas conflict. I did so using *The Wired Word* Bible study curriculum, which aims to look at newsworthy events in the world through the lens of scripture. Our own study meets on Sunday evenings at 7:00 pm via Zoom and touches on a wide variety and array of topics. This month's topics and scriptures are listed below:

January 14 "What are the Limits on What Christian Faith Can Fix?"

OT: 2 Kings 5:10-12 NT: Matthew 6:27

January 21 "Young Israeli Goes to Jail Rather Than Enlist to Fight in Gaza"

OT: Daniel 3:16-18, 28-29 NT: Matthew 22:15-22

January 28 "Americans Feel Exhausted When Thinking About Politics"

OT: Daniel 1:1-17 NT: Matthew 22:15-22

February 4 "Who is Too Old, Who Decides, and When?"


Psalter:Psalm 92:12-15 OT: Deuteronomy 31:1-8, 14-15

Per Capita

- ➤ Per capita is a **per member** apportionment for the operating budget of Presbytery, Synod, and General Assembly.
- > 2024 per capita is \$29.50 per member
- Members are asked to pay this amount over and above their pledge amount
- > Congregations pay per capita for each member.
- Flushing Presbyterian Church pays per capita for each member whether the member helps offset the cost or not
- ➤ If members help offset per capita cost, more dollars are available for church projects, mission, etc.

Please consider using your per capita envelope to submit \$29.50 for each person in your family who is a member of the church (or simply indicate "Per Capita" on the memo line of your check).



Resolve to Go Micro

Most New Year's resolutions are so major they seem made to be broken. Maybe that's why "micro-resolution" is the latest January buzzword. Setting smaller goals is more realistic and helps ensure follow-through, according to experts. People who try setting micro-resolutions say that approach is more positive and leads to longer-lasting change. For example, instead of attempting to lose 30 pounds this year, make a micro-resolution to walk 10 minutes twice per day and to snack on fresh fruit at least once a day.

Micro-resolutions can also be helpful in matters of faith. If aiming to read the entire Bible in one year feels overwhelming, take five minutes each morning and evening to read a brief devotional or pray. If joining your church's missions committee isn't possible, try to talk to one new person each week about your faith or church. May God bless you as you take small steps that add up to big impact this year!
