

### July 28, 7 PM - A Service of Healing

"Healing services and a healing ministry are subjects that make many Reformed Christians skeptical or uneasy. We've heard countless stories of the trickery and fraud of superstar 'faith healers' who've gathered millions of dollars as they've led their healing rallies around the country, and they've left a bad taste in our mouth. We've also been taught that John Calvin believed that the gifts of the Spirit ceased with the apostolic age. That philosophy has been reflected in the practice of our own congregations, most of which have never witnessed the anointing and laying on of hands that are part of a healing service." <sup>1</sup>

So why would we, at Flushing Presbyterian Church, even consider conducting a service of healing or wholeness? A great question. One the Spiritual Growth (SG) Team has been considering for months because of a request to use a spiritual gift.

SG and the pastor began a discussion: Was this Biblically sound? Do Presbyterians even do such a thing? What would such a service look like? And addressed the very real underpinnings of - This makes us really nervous and uncomfortable!

What We Found: The Book of Order, PC(USA) governing manual, has a section on what a "Service of Wholeness" should be (BO W-3.5400) and why we might have such a service. In short, a Service of Healing/Wholeness with the Laying on of Hands (if desired) is enacting a piece of Jesus' ministry (we know he conducted many acts of healing, both physical and spiritual) and is a focus on prayer.

With that information and the sincerity of the request, SG took the request to Session who voted to move forward with this special worship service. We are seeking to be faithful and trying to step out of the way so the Spirit might lead us.

It is with confidence in Christ, that you are invited to explore this special worship service. It will be a worship service with prayers, singing, a short meditation, some "open space," and opportunities for anointing with oil and laying on of hands.

Come explore. The Spirit moves in many ways. We are opening a door for renewal and wholeness. Amen!






## Opportunities To Serve
