My 3-year-old nephew was having a hard time falling asleep at Grandma's house, so my mom lay down beside him for a while. As she started to ease out of the room, his eyes flew open. "You're safe," she reminded him. "Jesus is always with you."

"I know, Grandma," he protested, "but I want someone with skin on!"

That reminded me of a quote by theologian Frederick Buechner: "Compassion is the sometimes fatal capacity for feeling what it is like to live inside somebody else's skin." God came to us as Jesus — someone "with skin on" — so we would know he understands what it's like to live inside our skin. Now as Jesus' body in the world, we're often called on to be someone "with skin on" to others. Indeed, we're to show them such compassion that we could just as well be wearing *their* skin.

### Ten Commandments



A Connecticut newspaper ran an article listing Ten Commandments to help the hard-of-hearing. The originator is John Leddo, Director of Audiology at the Easter Seal Rehabilitation Center of Eastern Fairfield County, CT.

- 1. Thou shalt not speak from another room.
- 2. Thou shalt not speak with your back toward the person with a hearing problem (or their back toward you).
- 3. Thou shalt not start speaking and walk away.
- 4. Thou shalt not start speaking and turn away from the person with a hearing problem.
- 5. Thou shalt not speak in competition with something else (turn off the water, or turn down the radio, etc.)
- 6. Thou shalt get the attention of the person with the hearing problem (do not start speaking while they are watching TV or reading)
- 7. Thou shalt try to speak face-to-face at all times.
- 8. Thou shalt try to remove obstructions while speaking (your hand from your face, the cigarette from your mouth, etc.)
- 9. Thou shalt try to speak distinctly.
- 10. Thou shalt try to be patient.



Family Promise of Genesee County is now fully operational. The Day Center, Coordinator, Part-time Social Worker, van and trailer are all working parts of the organization. Many active volunteers donate needed items, food and much of their time. There are 30+ Host and Support Congregations actively involved. One family that was in the program has already transitioned back to a home and independent family life.

All of the love and support, however, won't keep the Family Promise doors open. Yearly expenses are \$110,000-\$112,000. Churches and their members donate about 40% of the budget and 30% is expected from grants. Two major fund raisers are planned to earn the remaining 30% (a "Gala Event" held during the winter and a 5K Run/Walk in the summer).

The "Give Me Shelter 5K Run/Walk" will take place at Davison Abernathy Park at 8:00 AM on Saturday, August 9th. Details and registration forms are available in the narthex or on-line at www.givemeshelter5k.com. Registration is \$25 (including a T-shirt if registered by July 30th or on-line by August 8th). Cost for ages 18 and under is \$18. The Kids' Fun Run is free. Please consider supporting this event as a participant, as a sponsor or by making a donation towards our church sponsorship.



A trailer has been donated to Family Promise to transfer our guests' beds from one Host Congregation to the next! The Host Congregation will be responsible for packing up the beds and moving the trailer to the next church. Now that the churches are grouped by location, this is not a long trip. Transfers need to occur on Sunday morning. The trailer will be left at each Host Congregation for their entire hosting week. All beds will not need to be removed from the trailer, only those needed for the week.

WE NEED A VOLUNTEER WITH A BASIC SIZE TRUCK TO TRANSPORT THE TRAILER. The trailer requires a two inch ball and needs to be moved before church, at about 8:00 am. The trailer weighs 1,300 pounds empty and is 7 feet wide by 14 feet long. **The first transport date is Sunday, July 27<sup>th</sup>.**

The duty of the Memorial Committee is to properly use and distribute monies donated to the Memorial Fund. Money given for memorials may be designated for special uses by the family of the deceased with guidance from the Memorial Committee. Designated items currently include pew repair, youth group, memorial garden, music, and spiritual growth. Funds that are not designated are to be used in a manner that is respectful of the people for whom the monies have been given. This is traditionally for items not covered by the operational budget. The Memorial Committee welcomes the input of church committees, pastor, church members, etc. to help discern the needs of the church. As of May 27, 2014 the balance in the designated fund is \$7,839 and the undesignated fund \$5,933.

The committee is also responsible for the upkeep of the memorial garden and updating the memorial book. The committee has authorized the expenditures of the following items: new attendance books found in the pews; magnetic usher badges; memorial donation box; cost of supply pastors for the summer; and ropes to reserve pews.




