Summer Projects

Besides our ongoing mission supported outreach projects, this summer we have three other projects we are supporting. One is for vulnerable people, one is for families and one is for our members and friends.

- 1. **Health Kits** these kits are part of a mission project which will be distributed throughout the Synod of the Covenant regions this summer. The purpose of the Mobile Health Fairs are to partner with PC(USA) presbyteries and congregations, ecumenical and community agencies in order to reach out to underserved and disadvantaged communities to provide free basic health screenings and referrals, and basic health education. Donations and kits are being collected until June 18th (see details later in Newsletter).
- 2. **Take-out Church** 10-inch pizza boxes filled with games, activities, and resources to use during vacation travel. Those hours in the car traveling can be perfect times for families to spend some of the time playing and talking together. The box is filled with fun and some serious components. Parents, grandparents and great-grandparents are encouraged to pick up a box and take it with them this summer. Keep it under the seat to be ready at any time. Be sure to let us know how you used the contents, what was helpful, and special moments which happened during your travels.
- 3. Flat Jesus We are again reminding you that Jesus is with you always, and remember to "take him with you" in a very real way by snapping a picture with Flat Jesus. Pastor Teresa will be posting pictures in the narthex of his travels. On Facebook we will update where Jesus' travels have taken him this summer. We know you go many places, don't forget to snap a pic.

Place in a Ziploc gallon bag, the following all NEW items:

1 washcloth 1 shampoo (10 oz)

1 comb or brush 1 conditioner (10 oz)

1 bar of soap (in wrapper) 1 toothbrush (in wrapper)

1 deodorant $(2 \frac{1}{2} \text{ oz})$ 1 toothpaste $(4-6 \frac{1}{2} \text{ oz})$

DO NOT include any other items in the kits because they need to be uniform.

DO NOT include any sample size items in the kits.

Other individual items needed: (DO NOT include in the health kit bags)

- Extra full size health kit items
- Sample sizes of toothpaste, soap, shampoo and deodorant
- Hand towels, socks, razors, dental floss, hair ties

Please Note ... Communion Sunday for July will be July 9th instead of July 2nd.
