Friends, fast approaching is the summer season, a time of nostalgia when our memories are thrown back against the currents of time. While our church calendar denotes this as "ordinary time" there's usually nothing ordinary about it! I like to think of this point of the year as a sabbath of sorts, where we emulate God's resting from the Divine labors of creation. We rest assured in taking our rest because Jesus was raised and God has done all the work! In this time we revel in the sunshine, take in the sights and sounds of fireworks, the rustling touch of the grass. We *rest*. We are at *play*. Maybe a better name for this season on the calendar is *extraordinary* time!

Yes, folks. Even the Presbyterians, we of the "Frozen Chosen" moniker, are allowed to cut loose every now and then. We're allowed to partake in a bit of fun and capture some of the joy that comes with being alive in the midst of God's creation. And to that end, life in the church will look a little different this summer than it does other times of the year. We're not called to a life of obligation; we are called to a life of faith. We're going to be doing some celebrating around this place. We have the opportunity to do so energetically, exuberantly and joyfully through the following means:

#### **Summer Bible Study**

The past few weeks we've looked into the gospels and the New Testament, but starting in June we'll be flipping the pages back and looking into Genesis, at some stories both familiar and not so familiar.

#### July "Scripture Lottery"

Have you ever come across a passage in the Bible that was so weird and fascinating, only to never hear it preached on a Sunday morning? I typically preach using the three-year Revised Common Lectionary, a tool that helps keep preachers disciplined and ensures that they're exposing the people in the pews to as much scripture as possible, and not preaching the same things over and over again. The lectionary, however, is FULL of holes and gaps. There are entire books of the Bible that get left out, never to be preached on if your pastor follows the lectionary.

During the month of June, we're going to pass a hat around during announcements and you can submit your choice for what I will be preaching on in the months of July and August. That's right! You get a say in what the sermon passage is for a given Sunday! The goal of this exercise is to expose us to stories that aren't as familiar and to approach our Bible with the realization that not every story is going to fit nicely into our modern perspective. Also, we follow the belief that everything in both the Old and the New Testament points to the saving work of the cross, to Jesus' death and resurrection. But there are some passages and stories that are *really* far out there. What do we do with such stories? Are they better off left alone, cast by the wayside? I like to think not, and I hope that when we're done with the Lottery, you'll feel the same way!

#### BELLA BLANTON ...

This summer Bella Blanton is traveling abroad, with a departure date of June 12<sup>th</sup>. She will be spending the first six weeks of her trip studying at the American School of Classical Studies at Athens (ASCSA) with a group of eighteen graduate students and one other undergraduate. The ASCSA is the United States' oldest overseas research center and offers students the ability to attain an advanced understanding of ancient Greek culture. The school's summer session, which Bella is attending, visits over sixty sites throughout Greece, spending three weeks in Athens, one week in the Peloponnese, one week on Crete and one week in Northern Greece. Afterwards, she is joining the University of Chicago's excavations at Tell Keisan, a site in northern Israel in the country surrounding Haifa. In the Iron Age, Keisan was part of a Phoenician Kingdom with close economic and cultural ties to the Israelites. Bella is looking forward to this opportunity to learn from scholars important to her field, Classical Archaeology, and beginning her next research project in the fall on Hellenistic (Greek World, c. 323 BCE – 31 CE) heroes in Western Asia Minor (roughly modern Turkey).



#### **KEEPING SCORE**

Baseball purists often delight in keeping detailed scorecards. So do many Christians — often unknowingly. Do you give yourself "credit" for your years in the faith? for the number of services or studies you attend? for the good deeds you perform? for the Bible verses and creeds you know by heart?

In Philippians 3:4-6, Paul recites his impressive scorecard, yet despite those credentials, he couldn't earn God's favor. Neither can we. Our tallies are all "loss" (v. 7) when compared to the righteousness that comes through faith in Christ (v. 9).

Attending church, serving and memorizing Scripture are good things. But we do them not to *get* right with God but because we *are* right with God — through Jesus.


