

The Session of Flushing Presbyterian Church continues to regularly evaluate the best ways to hold inchurch worship services while keeping our members safe. We are thankful to all that have remained positive and cooperative during these uncertain times.

- Contract Tracing Guests and Visitors are asked to stop on their way out of church and leave contact information with an usher on Sunday morning. If any individual that has attended a Sunday worship service is diagnosed as being positive for Covid-19, an email will be sent to our entire email list making everyone aware. Members that are not on the email list will be contacted by phone. Each person that attended that same service should then monitor themselves for symptoms.
- Small group meetings will continue to be allowed in the church for groups of ten people or less, wearing masks and using cleaning supplies we will provide to clean up after themselves. Additionally, each group is asked to take attendance for their group. Attendance sheets will be available by the cleaning supplies, just outside of Fellowship Hall. There will be a tray for the completed attendance sheets.

The beginning of Advent
