Have you ever been to IKEA? Although I've never been to this particular one, I know that the closest IKEA to Flushing is located in Canton, MI. I figure at least some of you have ordered, then built, furniture from the store. Back in southwestern Pennsylvania, we had an IKEA between Pittsburgh and the International Airport. I used to pass it all the time on the way to visit extended family in Aliquippa. That is, until the month before I moved away to school. Then it was no longer a store of curiosity; I would go in and see the store for myself.

IKEA furniture is meant to be three things: 1) on the less expensive side (2) built easily (3) taken apart fairly easily. All of this makes it perfect for the transient college student who moves around multiple times in their 4+ years at school. The instruction manuals and the names for the furniture are entertaining, as well. They're all Icelandic in nature. The whole manual experience, with its visual details and pictorial diagrams, reminds me a lot of LEGO, if LEGO were aimed more toward adults.

Maybe you had a LEGO set, or Lincoln Logs, or an Erector set, or Tinkertoys. And if you didn't have any of these growing up, maybe you have fond memories of building a sand castle at the beach, or a snowman after the first heavy snowfall of winter. Can you remember what you placed on the pure white and blank face? Can you remember working your snowman until your fingers felt stiff from the cold, until your mittens were soaked through? Can you remember feeling a swelling sense of pride that your sandcastle was the biggest on the beach, only to watch as the tide rose and mercilessly toppled your spires?

Think about the childlike joy and glee you had from making something. When we engage our imaginative powers and when we create, I argue that's when we're closest to God in our form and function. God is known by the creative powers God shows; in Genesis we're told that God created everything – out of nothing! Old Testament prophet Jeremiah refers to God as the potter, shaping his people who are made from clay. God's creative powers are on full display throughout our Bible.

And it is that set of creative powers that the Lord wants us to use, as God did before us. Please prayerfully consider volunteering of your time and energy on Saturday, September 9 for our own hosted Sleep in Heavenly Peace Bed Build. This event runs from 9:00 am to 2:00 pm, or until we run through the total number of 30+ beds. Get in touch with your own creative powers and build! Think about the sense of wonder and accomplishment that you will feel. But friends, this is no mere building for enjoyment's sake, make no mistake. With these acts of building, we will glorify the Lord. We will give the gift of beds to those who have none of their own. We will bless others – the little children that Jesus lets come to him – as God has first blessed us.

If you want to love others as God has first loved you, if you want to truly make a difference in this world, if you want your actions and service to match your worship, then go forth . . . And build.


