Church Growth Conversations
#1: Why Are We Not Growing Faster?

Sunday, August 28th, we had the first in a series of conversations around church growth. Session has been reading the book, *Lasting Impact*, by Carey Neiuwhof, senior pastor of Connexus Church. We like this book because it is practical and we have heard truths.

Sunday, we quickly went over 10 common reasons congregations do not grow. A few which stood out for us were: seeing the culture as the enemy; being more in love with the past than the future; and being afraid to risk what is for what might be. There were others which were discussed, but this gives you a feel for some of the thoughts expressed.

We then moved to discuss ways churches grow: Having a mission, vision and strategy which connects with people and effectively fulfills the church mission. Easy enough, but most churches fall short in strategy, "how" you carry out the mission and vision.

Our mission: To know Jesus Christ and make His love known to others around us.

Session asked: How do we do this? How do we bring others to Christ and how do we ourselves grow?

Session believes we do well "Gathering" to worship, but need to do better providing "Growing" in faith opportunities. Thus the reason we will now have worship followed by small group learning opportunities. Choir will be able to participate for the first time ever in this time of learning on Sunday.

The group also provided ideas for enhancing our strategy - the way in which we "Go Out" into and be a part of the community. More on that another time.

Conversation #2: How Do We Respond As People Attend Church Less Often?

The Heidelberg Catechism says that our faith in Christ comes from the Holy Spirit, who produces it in our hearts "by the preaching of the holy gospel" (Q&A 65). And believers must use their gifts so that "others may be gained to Christ" (Q&A 86). This year, Spiritual Growth and Session want to encourage the sharing of the gospel message and bringing friends, family and others from the community to worship together.


Family Promise TRAINING



"All who eat and drink without discerning the body, eat and drink judgment against themselves." (I Cor. 11:29)

The first Sunday in October is designated as World Communion Sunday, which celebrates our oneness in Christ with all our brothers and sisters around the world. Paul tells us that we are to "discern the body" when we partake of Holy Communion, mindful that we note our relationship to all our brothers and sisters in Christ in the celebration. One is not to go hungry while another is drunk! (I Cor. 11:21). This is scandalous behavior opposed to the Way of Christ. Thus it is appropriate that World Communion Sunday is also a time when we annual Peace and receive Witness Offering as a way of continuing the ancient Christian practice of sharing what we have with brothers and sisters in need.

Setting the table of peace

Every day, we are witnesses to conflict. We read news stories of violence and supposedly irreparable divides. Angry rhetoric fills our airwaves, inboxes, and social media feeds. We see conflict tear apart communities, families, even people we know. Surrounded by this strife, it's easy to see the world through a dark lens of discord. We may even come to share the doubt expressed in Psalm 78:19: "Can God spread a table in the wilderness?"

Yet our faith tells us despite our doubts, sins, distrust, or even anger, God not only sets a table, but invites us to join it and partake in an abundance of peace.

The Peace & Global Witness Offering challenges us to look at the world not as a place where conflict is inevitable, but where Christ's peace is possible. The programs supported by the Peace & Global Witness Offering help to bring people tables of peace, justice, and reconciliation even in the wilderness of war, violence, and division. In places of abiding conflict, the Peace & Global Witness Offering supports the work of Presbyterian mission co-workers to bring together former enemies and begin healing the spiritual wounds of war.
